

Urology Partners of Nebraska Perform First Aquablation Therapy in Lincoln

A procedure that treats a common condition in men with no incisions and no heat.

LINCOLN, Neb. - June 7, 2024 - Urology Partners of Nebraska announced today that they have completed their first Aquablation therapy, making them the first practice in Lincoln to do so. Aquablation treats lower urinary tract symptoms (LUTS) due to benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) or enlarged prostate. This minimally invasive, groundbreaking procedure utilizes image-guided, high-precision waterjet technology.

The procedure was completed by Adam Mues, MD, urologist with Urology Partners. "We are proud to be among the first in our region to offer a solution for men with BPH that provides significant, long-lasting symptom relief with lower risk to their sexual function or continence," said Dr. Mues. "Aquablation therapy is the next step to furthering our commitment to cutting-edge technologies such as robotic surgery and dedication to men's health." The newly formed practice is located at the April Sampson Cancer Center and offers complete urology services.

Aquablation is a no-incision, no-heat procedure that uses a high-pressure water jet controlled by robotic technology to precisely remove excess prostate tissue to relieve BPH symptoms. BPH is a common condition in men, characterized by the enlargement of the prostate gland, leading to urinary difficulties. Aquablation offers an innovative approach to address this issue, combining the accuracy of robotics with the gentleness of water. This innovative therapy offers long-term relief to BPH symptoms with a minimal risk of side effects or complications.

"Aquablation therapy represents a substantial step forward in urological care, and our team is committed to delivering the most advanced and effective treatments," Mues said. "We are proud to offer this innovative treatment to the community of Lincoln."
